

# Licking County Leaders Summit March 21, 2019 | Denison University



## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. ***“How do I get to the Summit?”***

Getting to the summit is up to each individual team. Your school can choose to send the team on a bus or each team member could be responsible for their own transportation. If you drive yourself, make sure you park in the parking structure. Directions, campus maps, and parking instructions are included in your acceptance packets. Each team (individuals and group) is fully responsible for any and all traffic related infractions associated with the summit.

2. ***“What if I register (individual or team) but cannot attend the Summit?”***

Once you submit a team registration, we presume all **individuals** on the registration application will attend. If you have a substitution, for any reason, please notify Pathways via e-mail ([choshor@pathwaysco.org](mailto:choshor@pathwaysco.org)) as soon as possible so your team information can be updated.

If your entire **team** is unable to participate in the Summit, for any reason, you are expected to notify Pathways no fewer than (2) two weeks prior to the Summit. Failure to do so can result in an invoice for the costs associated with your participation.

3. ***“What should I wear to the Summit?”***

Feel free to wear whatever is comfortable and appropriate to wear at school.

4. ***“What should I do when I arrive at the summit?”***

Waiting near the auditorium is your Summit host and he/she will take you to your seats. If your team members are arriving independently, wait in the lobby for your entire team to arrive and you will be seated in the auditorium together.

5. ***“Who are the people in the staff shirts?”***

The Youth Leadership Council of Licking County is an award winning youth prevention and leadership development project comprised of high school students

who collaboratively work to help make Licking County a happy, healthy, safe and drug free place to live, work and go to school.

6. ***“What will I need to bring with me?”***

If you would like to take notes, a writing utensil and paper, or an electronic device such as a tablet could be useful, but not required. Each person is responsible for his/her belongings and Pathways and/or the YLC cannot be held responsible for broken, stolen or damaged personal belongings.

7. ***“Am I getting lunch, should I bring money?”***

Lunch will be provided to you at no cost. There are vending machines located throughout the campus that you may choose to use, in which case you would need to bring cash.

8. ***“How long is the Leaders Summit?”***

The 2019 Licking County Leaders Summit will take place over the course of a typical school day. Arrival is at 8:00 am with structured activities beginning at 8:30am. The day will conclude at approximately 1:30pm.

9. ***“Will there be food?”***

10. ***“What materials will be provided to me?”***

Each team will receive a “team box” complete with t-shirts, resources and swag for all registered teams!

11. ***“What is the role of the adult allies on our team?”***

The adult allies are just as important to the team as the students. Adult allies collaborate with and support the team in their learning and development. Allies encourage student members to maintain a strong leadership and prevention lifestyle.
